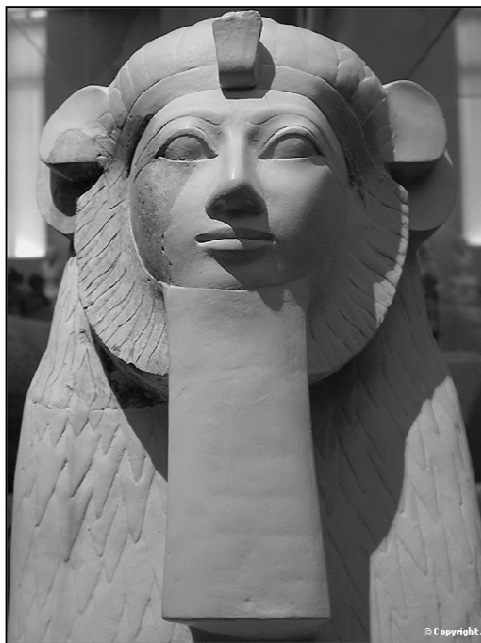
a dam built to hold back

- built more monuments and temples than any other pharaoh



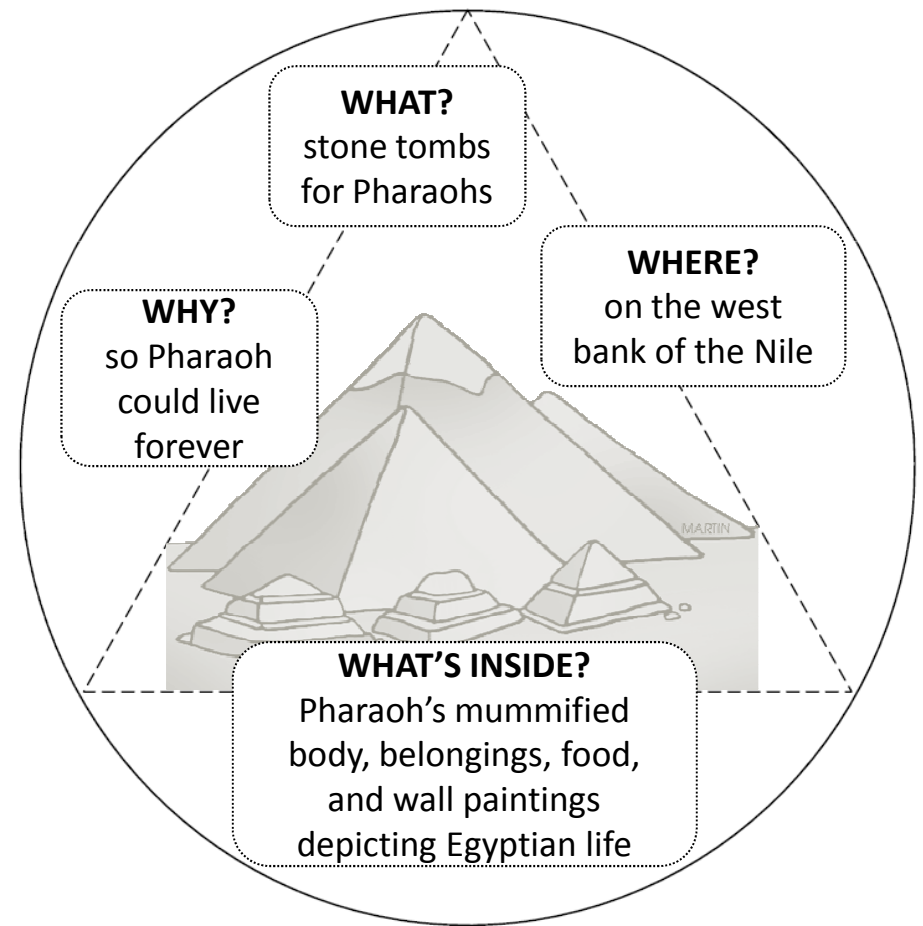
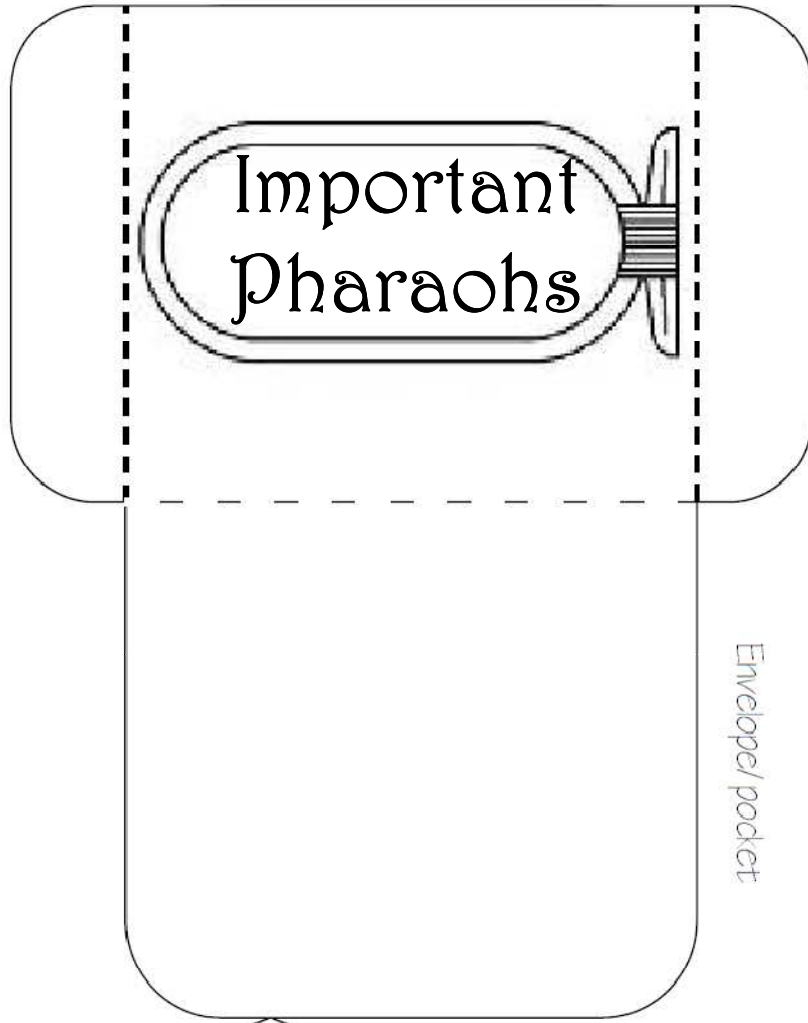
### **Pharaoh Hatshepsut**

- one of the most successful and peaceful rules of any Egyptian Pharaoh

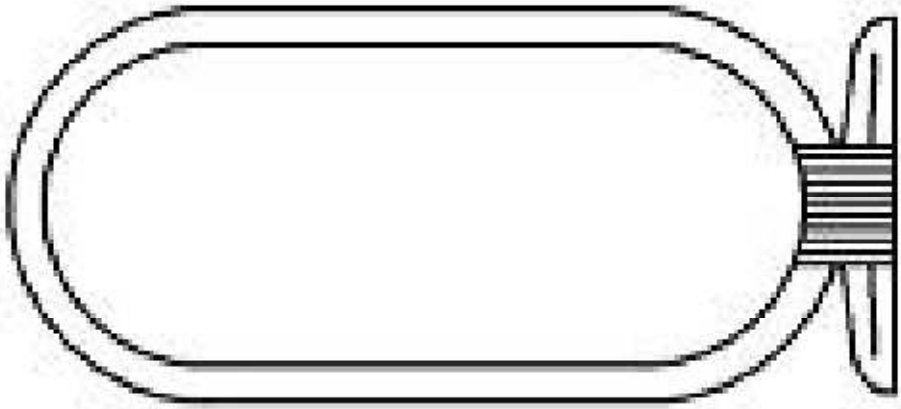



### **King Tutankhamen**

- nicknamed “King Tut”
- became the ruler of Egypt when he was only nine years old
- died at the age of 19
- tomb was found untouched, and burial chamber contained over 600 valuable objects

## The Great Sphinx of Giza

- built to protect the pyramids
- animal god representation of a pharaoh
- largest monolith statue (carved from a single stone) in the world!
